Day One	9am-5pm	<p><u>9am – Welcome</u></p> <p><u>9.30am – Theory – Introduction to Acrylates</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It's time to get into Chemistry, learning the ins and outs of the products you work with most often. Today we start to understand more about plastics and polymerization before delving further into a couple of types of plastics – Cyanoacrylates and Oligomers. <p><u>10.30am – Natural Liquid and Powder Extensions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You thought you had these nailed, right? You do – <i>if</i> the client wants them painted. If not, you're going to need to disguise their short natural nail somehow or the finished effect won't be so cute. We're going to use a 'cover powder' to do that and we're going to <i>blend</i> the cover powder out to clear powder at the cuticle for a more natural look with better adhesion. <p><u>12.30pm – Break</u></p> <p><u>1.30pm – Reverse French Application</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Once again, you thought you had French nailed, right? You are a soon-to-be master of traditional application, but some techs prefer 'reverse application' – and some techniques require it. <p><u>4.30pm – Wind Down and Review</u></p>	<p>You and your partner will need models at 10.30am and 1.30pm.</p>	

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Day Two	9am-5pm	<p><u>9am – Welcome</u></p> <p><u>9.30am – Theory – Polymers and Acrylate Characteristics</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There's one more important type of acrylate we haven't covered yet – polymers. • Once we know lots about each type of plastic, it's time to focus on the characteristics of those plastics and what they mean for us in the salon. <p><u>10.30am – French Liquid and Powder with Extended Nail Bed</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yesterday we learned how to blend to colours together to disguise a short natural nail plate, and we also learned how to do reverse application. Today we combine both techniques – this is the most advanced set you will do during your training. <p><u>1.30pm – Break</u></p> <p><u>2.30pm - Liquid & Powder Rebalance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Following on from your backfill lesson in Module Two, we learn how to rebalance. Rebalancing is a very similar maintenance service which also allows us to move (or 'rebalance') the French tip. • Just for fun, we're going to use Glitter Powder to create our new tips! 	<p>You and your partner will need models at 10.30am and 2.30pm.</p> <p>The 2.30pm model will ideally already have extensions on that are at least a week old.</p>	

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Day Three	9am-5pm	<p><u>9am – Welcome</u></p> <p><u>9.30am – Theory – ‘Diagnosing’ your Clients</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It’s not enough to know how to <i>do</i> each technique – <i>why</i> are you doing it? Where a big fan of ‘the why’ here at Monaco, and don’t believe in doing or saying something ‘just because’. With your new-found chemistry knowledge and a wee bit of experience under your belt, learn in this session why you shouldn’t just accept that a client wants a certain service and how to ‘diagnose’ if something else would work better for their wants and needs. <p><u>10.30am - Natural Hard Gel Extensions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We’re moving on from Liquid and Powder for a while, focusing instead on Hard Gels. The gel itself is <i>very</i> different to Acrylic, but everything else (prep, forms, tips, filing) is the same so with this already under your belt, picking up gel is a piece of cake! <p><u>1pm – Break</u></p> <p><u>2pm - French Hard Gel Extensions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expand your Gel skills by learning how to complete a French-look Hard Gel Extension. <p><u>4.30pm – Wind Down and Review</u></p>	You and your partner will need models at 11.05am and 2pm.	

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Day Four	9am-5pm	<p><u>9am – Welcome</u></p> <p><u>9.30am – Theory – Nail Biters</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss the reasons people bite their nails and the best ways to help them stop. • Discover easy, temporary ways to make a nail biter look great for a special occasion. • Learn which techniques to use if applying enhancements and how to do so safely. <p><u>10.30am - Hard Gel Rebalance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Today we learn how to maintain Hard Gel enhancements, practicing a Rebalance <p><u>1pm – Break</u></p> <p><u>2pm – Hard Gel Removal, Cracks & Breaks</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As with Liquid and Powder, now that we know how to apply Gel, we’re going to learn how to take it off safely. We’ll also practice repairing cracks and breaks beforehand. We’ll be working on each other, using the Overlay nails you did earlier in the week. <p><u>3.30pm – Shapes</u></p> <p><u>4.30pm – Wind Down and Review</u></p>	<p>You and your partner will need models at 11am and 2pm.</p> <p>The first model at 11am will ideally already have Acrylic or Hard Gel extensions on that are at least a week old.</p> <p>The second model at 2.20pm will ideally already have Hard Gel extensions on and be happy to have them removed.</p> <p>You <i>might</i> have time to finish her nails with Gel Polish if you like.</p>
